Science article guidelines

We are seeking science-focused articles for publication in future issues of our high-profile magazine.

A science-focused article in "sensed" will give your research project exposure to around 1500 international readers. This can raise the profile of your research and potentially increase citations of your published work. A science article for sensed magazine can be submitted to the editors at any time. We carefully review the content and if appropriate for publication, your article will appear in the next available issue. We do not pay authors for writing articles.

We have provided a few brief guidelines detailing the types of articles we are looking for, alongside some basic guidelines for article submission. Please get in touch with us at newsletter@rspsoc.org if you would like to submit an article, or if you have any questions.

A good science-focused article can be:

- A thought-provoking review of a paradigm, method or approach in remote sensing and photogrammetry - i.e. a piece to invoke discussion in the community
- A summary of a new development in the field of remote sensing or photogrammetry, arising from a recent publication, award, or conference presentation
- A review of a meeting, with a commentary on the science presented
- An overview of a new development in the commercial sector, a sensor launch, or a new product
- An exciting news story relating to remote sensing and/or photogrammetry (e.g. a case study of how these technologies were used in disaster management)

A science-focused article should be submitted according to the following guidelines:

- Please format your article as a word document, and email it to the editors (newsletter@rspsoc.org), according to the deadlines shown on the left. Special formatting, footnotes, or embedded citations cannot be supported.
- Please edit your article so that it contains no more than 800 words. As a guide we recommend a maximum of 4300 characters (including spaces). Articles longer than this will be returned to the authors with a request to shorten the length.
- Include at least three high quality graphics, photographs or images relating to the subject of the article, and provide captions for these in the word document. Required formats for these images are jpg, gif or png. Images should be sent as separate files rather than embedded inside the word document.
- Please send us a short biography of the author(s), including contact details (i.e. email address) and a head-and-shoulders photo.
- Where appropriate, please include up to two references to relevant publications by the author.
